2020 CENSUS - SEPTEMBER 30TH DEADLINE!

Make Shrewsbury Township Count!

- **Count every resident:** It's important to make sure every township resident, young and old, is counted. Critical dollars and representation are at stake.
- **Who is required to respond?** Everyone living in the United States and its five territories is required by law to be counted in the 2020 Census, as mandated by the Founding Fathers in the U.S. Constitution.
- **Did you know?** This is the first time the census can be filled out online.
- It can also be completed by mail and phone.



How the 2020 Census helps Shrewsbury Township

Here's why responding to the 2020 Census is important:

Federal and state funding

Federal, state, and municipal officials make decisions about how billions of dollars in public funds are allocated for schools, roads and bridges, fire and emergency services, health care, and more based on census statistics. Programs include those for:

Municipalities:

- * *Liquid fuels funds for roads and bridges*
- * *Natural gas impact fees*
- * *Grants targeted to municipalities*

Older people and low-income populations:

- * *Medicare*
- * *Medicaid*
- * *Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)*
- * *Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)*

College students:

- * *Federal Pell Grants*
- * *Career and technical education grants*
- * *Adult education grants*

Young Children:

- * *Head Start*
- * *National School Lunch Program*
- * *Title IX Funding*

IN-PERSON TAX COLLECTION

CANCELLED FOR 2020

When printing the 2020-21 school real estate bills, the tax collector planned to collect in person at the Township office.

However, due to the township office remaining closed to the public until further notice, in-person tax collections have been cancelled for the remainder of the year.

Taxes must be mailed to the tax collector. It is suggested that you mail early, and if date critical, ask the post office to postmark the payment when you drop it off for mailing (postmark determines payment date).

Include a self addressed, stamped, envelope, and the tax collector will return your copy of the tax bill back to you stamped paid.

GENERAL ELECTION - NOVEMBER 3, 2020

The upcoming General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 3rd with polls opening at 7:00 a.m. and closing at 8:00 p.m. The following information includes important dates leading up to the election, as well as useful website links.

Important Dates to Remember

- **October 19th** (Monday) - Last day to REGISTER for the General Election.
- **October 27th** (Tuesday) - Last day to APPLY for a Mail-IN or Civilian Absentee ballot.
- **November 3rd** (Tuesday) - General Election (7:00 a.m.—8:00 p.m.).
- **November 3rd** (Tuesday) - 8:00 p.m. deadline for county elections office to receive Mail-In and Civilian Absentee ballots.
- **November 10th** (Tuesday) - Last day for military and overseas absentee ballots to be received by the county elections office.

EXIT 4 IMPROVEMENTS

The \$29.2 million I-83 Exit 4 Improvements Project continues on schedule with a completion date scheduled for **Summer 2021**.



Kinsley was awarded the contract to build the diverging diamond interchange (DDI), with work to include: Replacing the existing, three-span I-83 bridge over SR 851 with a two-span bridge; Lengthening and reconfiguring the ramps leading on to and off of I-83; Replacing the culvert that carries Deer Creek beneath the interchange; Installation of new traffic signals at the interchange; Pile-driving 4,800 linear feet of foundation bearing piles for bridge foundations; Numerous stream relocations; Improving the storm water management system, including installation of 67 storm inlets, 3,200 linear feet of storm sewer systems and three storm water facilities; 1,300 linear feet of curbing. STORAGE OF BOATS, CAMPERS, TRAILERS & RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

With the camping and boating season coming to an end, remember that boats, campers, trailers, utility trailers, and other similar recreational and utility apparatus cannot be parked or stored in a front yard (defined as the area between the front wall of the principal building and the street) for more than three (3) days in any seven (7) day period. A recreational vehicle is defined to include a trailer, house trailer, camper, snowmobile, off-road vehicle, all-terrain vehicle (ATV), golf cart, boat trailer, or other similar vehicle or piece of equipment.

Side and rear yard storage is permitted.
